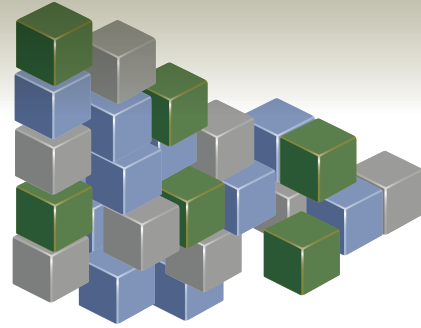

The 2009 Sustainability Report details the results of Toyota Australia's management of environmental, community and employee sustainability issues, and the special projects which helped to achieve the results.

Seamus Power, Managing Director, Autoliv Australia will provide a commentary on European trends and local achievements.

Autoliv is a Swedish-based company that has 80 facilities in 30 vehicle-producing countries. In recent years, Autoliv Australia has been awarded the Toyota Presidents award for both TPS and for the Environment.

The format for the day is to encourage dialog between all organisations to learn about what other companies are doing, and share some of your experiences in linking manufacturing excellence with the business of sustainability

The keynote speakers will also participate in a Q&A panel session following the morning presentations, and join us for a networking lunch hosted by Sustainability Victoria.

Ian Young, i2e Director and facilitator of the *Lean to Green* program will lead a dialog session where all participants will be encouraged to network and actively share their own experiences and leverage their learnings by discussing goals and plans for 2010.
